

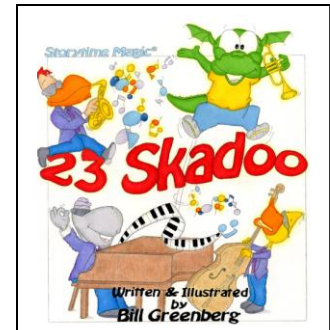
Activity 3
