

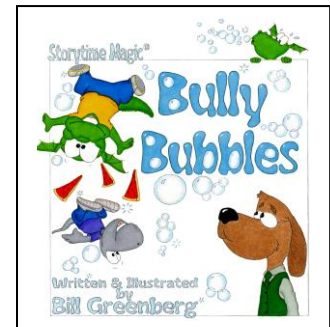

- * Go on a “mini-field trip” by walking around your apartment/or house/or school. (Do this with at least one other person; and/or have everyone in the class do this.)
- * Write down as many adjectives as you can think of to describe different things/objects you see. [*For example: a round, twelve numbered, minute handed, hour handed, silver and white _____ (clock).*]
- * Share/read the **adjectives only** for **one** of the things you saw.
- * When someone guesses what that thing/object was: they get to read the **adjectives only** for one of their objects (etc.). Can anyone guess what you're describing?
