

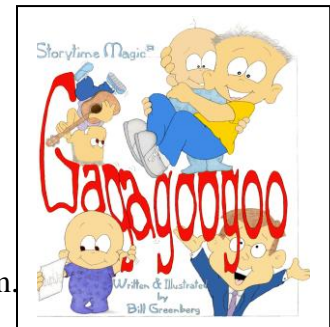

### Gagagoogoo

Freddy was so upset, that he jumped up and down – stood on his head while playing his guitar and kazoo – and made animal sounds: “Cockle-doodle-doo, moooooo, awooooo!” Somehow his *ga-ga-googoo-ing*, peek-a-boo-ing, *koo-chee-koo-chee-koo-ing*, burbling baby brother has to save him.



Freddy and his little-baby brother used lots of animal sounds and baby talk sounds in this book. Words that sound very much like the *actual* sounds are called “*onomatopoeias*”; for example, *moo* (a cow sound), *awooo* (a coyote howl), *cockle-doodle-doo* (a rooster sound), etc. Words like these can make a story more interesting.

- \* Name as many sounds (*onomatopoeias*) as you can.
- \* Choose how you want to spell them, or get help with this.
- \* You can use animal, vehicle, weather, baby sounds, etc.
- \* Make up a story using *some* of these words.
- \* Read the story out loud and make the sounds come alive.

It’s a fun challenge.
