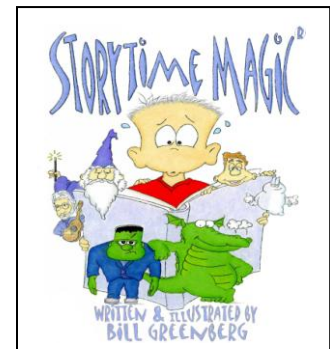


Activity 2



Storytime Magic

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Ahhhhhhhhhh! Freddy is really panicking now. Stuck alone in his locked classroom forever; is there any magical adventure that will free him: ghosts, Frankenstein, witches, recess, wizards, pizza? Abracadabra, alacazam, hocus pocus, presto chango, shazam, ibble-de-bibble-de?

On the first and last page of the book; the picture shows someone whispering a secret to her friend. That's kind of rude; but wouldn't it be interesting if *passing notes* (with pictures and/or words) would be okay for awhile? Writing takes practice (pictures for younger children); so try this fun activity to become a better writer.

- * Everyone gets ten little pieces of paper. (Place extra little slips of on a table if anyone runs out.)
- * Pick a period of time when everyone can communicate with each other all they want; but they can't talk. Students/children (and the teacher or parent) can only pass notes to each other (for example: ask what your favorite animal is; your favorite color, etc.)
- * You can point or use sign language (just no talking).
- * When time is up, take some time to share your experience.
